I am fascinated by environmental studies and how our earth provides for us. For my final project, I wanted to create a piece about how humans perceive the earth as well as what is ours to take. More often than not, we take more than we need. This is a concept that has truly been prevalent in my mind since reading *Braiding Sweetgrass* by ecologist, Dr. Robin Wall Kimmerer. I encourage you to think about natural resources like corn, meat, water, soil, etc. that fuel your daily lives and reflect while viewing my piece. I chose to work on wood and leave the majority of it exposed to show how nature has bolstered my painting.

I used oil paints to create the imagery on my wooden plank and wood burning tools to somewhat destroy the imagery. By creating the wood burned cuts of the pig, I am portraying how humans perceive pigs and how they serve us as a food source. Every plant or living thing in my painting is a living commodity that humans notoriously exploit.
